## MEETING VENUE

The Meeting will be held in Loughborough, Leicestershire. It is a Market and University Town in the centre of the UK.



The town is surrounded by beautiful countryside including Charnwood Forest and Bradgate Park which is home to the ruins of Bradgate House, birthplace of Lady Jane Grey who was Queen of England in 1554 for just nine days!

With a population of approximately 60,000 (including around 20,000 students from Loughborough University and Loughborough College) the town has a great mix of young, vibrant bars and clubs and many restaurants.

Loughborough has a well maintained park (Queens Park), right in its centre, with its iconic war memorial – the Carillon, stood at its centre.

Loughborough is home to John Taylor Bellfounders, the world's largest bell foundry, which made the bells for the Carillon war memorial in the Queens Park as well as the Great Paul for St. Paul's Cathedral and York Minster. It is mentioned in the 1086 Domesday Book.

If you like spice, you've come to the right place! Loughborough is only a short distance from the Curry Capital of England (Leicester) and their great flavours can be found here too! Salim's, near the Premier Inn, is one of the best of a large number of Indian, Bangladeshi and Nepalese restaurants in Loughborough.
